# PPTA's concerns



#### **General concerns**

- The Teaching Council has expanded its functions since 2010.
- It now wants to pass on these costs to teachers.
- Our members have told us they don't want the Teaching Council to have these expanded functions.
- They don't want to pay for them.



#### What we want the Council to do

"Entrances and exits"

- 1. Monitor ITE
- 2. Registration
- 3. Conduct and competency

All things they were doing in 2010



#### What we don't want them to do

- provide direction for teachers
- enhance the status of teachers
- identify and disseminate best practice in teaching and foster the profession's continued development in light of research and evidence of changes in society and technology

In short: no professional development please



#### What about the leadership stuff?

- The changes to the Teaching Council legislation now make any of the work relating to leadership:
- Optional (not required by law)
- Subject to Ministerial approval
- Not subject to a fee or levy



#### **Concern 1: the process is not user friendly**

- The documents are long and complex:
- 50 pages!
- 20 page "summary"
- 10 proposals
- We didn't see these documents in advance



### **Concern 2: the timing is not responsive**

- Term 1 is never ideal
- During the Omicron peak is worse
- Everyone is adapting
- Could extend the time frame as requested by PPTA
- $\rightarrow$  Process dissuades people from participating



#### **Concern 3: Nothing's changed**

- 2020 consultation: **\$470**/\$500 for three years
- 2020 decision: \$157 for one year (\$471 over three years)
- 2022 consultation table: **\$472.21** for three years
- The amount appears fixed



#### **Concern 4: The numbers are wrong**

Expert opinion: Business and Economic Research Limited (BERL)

- Use of the Consumer Price Index (which is for households) instead of the Producer Prices Index used by other similar organisations.
- Use of an unknown "wages index" to calculate wage increases.
- This "wages index" puts wage inflation at 40.4% almost double the Labour Cost Index (again used by similar organisations) figure of 19.2%
- <u>The correct inflation costs of the Teaching Council sit at 19.2%, significantly</u> <u>less than the 33%</u>



#### What do we want then?

Both the 2020 and 2022 consultation seek to convince teachers of the **actual** costs of the Teaching Council.

They do not seek feedback as to what teachers consider to be **reasonable** costs.



#### What is reasonable?

- Teachers only want to pay for activities that they actually want the Council to do **not** the expanded functions.
- What consideration has there been of restricting spending?
- What amount are teachers prepared to pay?



#### What we think is reasonable

An inflation based increase (no payment for increased functions)

Using the indices given by BERL (not the Teaching Council ones)

= 19.2% increase on all fees and the levy

For a 3-year renewal this is \$42.40 extra, coming to a total fees/levy charge of **\$263.20** 



#### What about the other proposals?

We consider these proposals to be a distraction from the real issue:

The fees and levy should only increase by 19.2% to adjust for inflation



### Look out for proposal nine

Proposal 9: Fix fees and the levy for a three-year period, with an allowance for expected inflation over the period.

Even in the long version, this is unclear.

Every three years, the fee/levy would go up by the estimated rate of inflation.

PPTA opposes this on principle. Every one is subject to inflation, but we don't have automatic adjustment.
