- » I want to do the absolute best for my students and that means being resourced properly to do that. Will your party increase education funding?
- » Will your party properly resource high quality and relevant professional development for every teacher, so we can be as effective as possible?
- » As a teacher, I spend too much time ticking boxes and dealing with red tape. What will your party do to allow teachers to focus more on each individual child?
